A "one-pager" is assigned to promote thoughtful appreciation and understanding of a novel or major literary work. The more creative you allow yourself to be, the more you will get out of this task. When we create visuals or organize information for representation, we build connections and internalize the information more completely.

## Use white, unlined paper.

## Front Side

- 1. Title of the work, author's name, and year of publication
- 2. Character: A list of the characters from the work
- 3. Setting: A description of when and where the work took place
- 4. Narration: Identify the narrator, point of view, and perspective from which the story or poem is told to the reader.
- 5. FIVE important quotes from the work.
- 6. At least 3 drawings, symbols, or images that represent aspects of the story
  - Use color, be creative, be neat, and fill the entire front page

## Back Side

- 7. Write your name and class period.
- 8. Plot/Poetic Structure: Write a one-paragraph (or longer) summary of the selection that includes details about the plot, setting, characters, main ideas, conflicts, and the ending.
- 9. Write a one-paragraph (or longer) statement about HOW this work speaks to the UNIVERSAL HUMAN EXPERIENCE.
